> 2ND IN THE NATION

Colorado ranks #2 on the State Technology and Science Index, ahead of Maryland (#3), California (#4) and Washington (#6).

> 3RD FASTEST GROWING EMPLOYER OF TECH JOBS

Job postings are a measure of employer demand for tech talent. **In Colorado, that figure reached over 133,842** in 2019, making Colorado the **third fastest growing employer of tech occupations** in the U.S.

> \$50B ECONOMIC IMPACT

With a **\$50B economic impact**, Colorado's tech industry makes up **14% of the state's economy**, a higher percentage than any other industry and is higher than the 10% U.S. average, ranked just after Washington (20%), California (18%), and Massachusetts (17%).


EDUCATED WORKFORCE:

Colorado has the 2nd highest educated workforce in the U.S. 42.7% of Coloradans hold a B.A. or higher (compare to the national average of 33.1%).



CURRENT WORKFORCE:

With over 130,000 workers in tech, Colorado ranks 4th in the nation for percentage of overall workforce employed in the tech industry or in a tech occupation.



DIVERSE WORKFORCE:

Averaging 50,000 net in-migration per year, Colorado ranks 3rd among peer states for migration of individuals into the state with a bachelor's degrees or higher.



REMOTE WORK:

COVID-19 has significantly altered the remote work landscape. Colorado is well-positioned to capitalize on this long-term trend with its higher wages and lower cost of living, attracting a more diverse and skilled pool of professionals from across the nation.




GROWTH & DIVERSITY OF FIRMS IN COLORADO



CORPORATE TAX RANKING




COLORADO'S COMPETITIVE COST OF LIVING



MARKET MATURITY

Colorado's tech hubs sit at a mid-market sweet spot where costs remain low relative to talent availability. The graph below shows variances among some of the nation's fastest growing tech markets relative to Denver by comparing available talent to median annual wages.
